Mrs. Julie Aswani, Mental Health Counsellor and Teacher

Julie was born with a rare physical condition called Arthrogryposis Multiplex Congenita (AMC) which affects one in 3000 live births. Despite being bullied, harassed, and discriminated against, Julie has come a long way to become the leading spokesperson for AMC in Hong Kong and is a mental health counsellor in Hong Kong and holds degrees in Psychology, Education and Counselling. She has worked with all age groups, from children to adolescents and adults. She is currently a high school teacher and provides counselling services to her students. She dedicates her time to raising awareness on different mental and physical health issues.



Ms. Siu Fong Yeung, Visual and Performance Artist

Siu Fong graduated from Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology (RMIT) University with a Bachelor of Arts (Fine Art). Siu Fong's creative works attempt to recognise the "body" as an object from different perspectives and observations. She explores relationships between the soul and the physique with her "body" and expresses it via various forms of media. Her recent series comprises paintings, ceramics, video, sound, and installation. Apart from participating in artistic creation, Siu Fong is also a performance artist.
